CAP Debt counselling

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) are a debt counselling charity who offer their services free of charge to anyone in unmanageable debt. The Chepstow & District Debt Centre is supported by Churches Together in Chepstow & District and takes clients from postcodes NP16 (Chepstow), NP26 (Caldicot, Rogiet, Magor) and NP15 1 (Usk).

When financial trouble hits, it's easy to feel alone and like no one can help, however CAP have been helping people out of debt for 21 years and there is always a solution. The service is confidential and the local Debt Centre manager can see you in your own home or wherever you choose.

Chepstow Foodbank

One would not think that there would be people living in Chepstow who needed help from a food bank, but there are.

People can face financial difficulties for so many different reasons and, when it's a struggle to pay bills and other outgoings, it can cause extra distress to then provide nourishing meals on a daily basis.

We don't think anyone in our community should have to face going hungry. That's why the Chepstow Foodbank provides three days' nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people who are referred to us in crisis

Foodbanks partner with a wide range of care professionals such as doctors, health visitors, social workers and police to identify people in crisis and issue them with a foodbank voucher. There is a box in the entrance hall of the Church where donations of food can be left. This box is emptied regularly and the contents taken to a Food Bank centre for distribution.
